Christ is Your Life Scriptures

For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. Philippians 1:21

What does the Apostle Paul mean when he says, "to live is Christ"? Many commentaries suggest that Paul intended to convey that he dedicated his life to Christ, encouraging us to do the same. However, it's important to note that Christ did not live FOR the Father; instead, He drew from the Father's life to reveal and manifest God's nature and character. Paul recognized his inadequacy in living FOR the Father. Rather, he surrendered his own abilities and, through faith, relied on God to empower his actions. Ultimately, the fruits and gifts of the Spirit must originate and flow from the Spirit. When Paul declared, "I die daily," he was not referring to a physical death. Instead, he meant that he renounced his self-sufficiency, viewing it as rubbish, allowing Christ's life to be expressed in and through him.

When Christ, who is our life, is revealed, then you also will be revealed with Him in glory. Colossians 3:4
